

Pupil Premium

Schools receive a payment, or Pupil Premium, for each child who is registered for free school meals and those who have been in continuous care for six months or more - £488 for 2011 - 12 and £600 for 2012-2013. From April 2012 the Pupil Premium was extended to include children who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years. Schools receive £200 (2011-2012) for pupils whose parents are serving in the armed forces rising to £250 for 2012-2013.

In 2011-2012, seven percent of the school population received pupil premium funding - £1,720

In 2011-2012, six percent of the school population received pupil premium funding - £4,800

Last year and this year, we used the funding towards the employment of an Inclusion Co-ordinator (INCo) who is able to assess, advise, create individual programmes of work tailored for individual need and monitor progress and achievement of pupils for whom we receive funding.

In addition, we are also able to support some children financially with enrichment activities
